2	MINUTES FROM THE PREVIOUS MEETING	
	The minutes from the previous meeting were agreed as a correct record.	
3	MATTERS ARISNG

4	FINANCES AND FUNDING	
	Annual recycling costs for 2024 were approx £95.4k. The high tides after the recycling work had resulted in some additional works costing approx £6.65k which were included in the overall cost. The likelihood of undertaking these works had been raised with the Funding Group previously.	
	No Jacobs costs were included in the cost, therefore construction costs were £94.1k of the total value, with the remaining costs going on things such as advertising, which was a legal requirement.	
	Catherine Harries caveated the above with the fact that the EA were still settling the end of year accounts, so there could be a small increase in total value due to project management time, but it was not anticipated there would be any significant additional costs.	
	It was noted that the predicted cost of the works was £100k and actual cost was £95.4k.	
	It was noted that the reserve build up had been used this year	

	 (£17,818) as part payment of the 23/24 contribution. Going forward to the 24/25 financial year there would be approximatedly £2.7k of PF contributions in the accounts. This had been calculated by applying the 59.35% PF contribtion to an underspend on this year's recycling. The £2.7k would be used towards the 2025 recycling campaign which would be undertaken in Feb/March as usual. Mike McDonnell had contacted Dave Robson in advance of the meeting and would send through the contribution for this year as required. It was confirmed that recycling was funded until 2031 in the EA base budget going forward.
