The above applications were received by the Local Planning Authority (King's Lynn and West Norfolk Borough Council) on 28 and 29 April 2022. Amendments have been submitted in respect of the above Planning Applications, accompanied by an Environmental Statement. I sent you a letter, dated 20 November 2024, notifying you of the consultation on this.

Unfortunately, we have realised that some of the documents submitted were not uploaded to the public file on our website. We sincerely apologise for the mistake.

In the interests of transparency and due process, we have decided that we must re-run the consultation. In view of this, please accept this letter as a further consultation on both applications. We have extended the opportunity for you to comment until **midnight on 24 JANUARY 2025**. I have set out below some notes for people who have already commented.

This is preferred because it instantly adds your comment to the application page and it also avoids adding new scanned documents, which slows down the running of the site.

Due to the large volume of comments we receive, we are unable to acknowledge or respond to individual comments.

The deadline for comments is midnight on 24 January 2025.
