King's Lynn and West Norfolk Local Plan 2021-2040: Main Modifica@ons Part 2 (Gypsy, Traveller and Travelling Showpeople) consulta@on (October –November 2024) –Anglian Water Response

Anglian Water is the statutory water and sewerage undertaker for the Borough Council for King's Lynn and West Norfolk and a statutory consultee under The Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regula⊕ons 2012. Anglian Water wants to proac⊕vely engage with the local plan process to ensure the plan delivers benefits for residents and visitors to the area, and in doing so protect the environment and water resources. As a purpose-led company, we are commiΣed to seeking posi⊕ve environmental and social outcomes for our region.

Anglian Water has engaged with the Council throughout the preparacon of the Local Plan and the examinacon process and welcomes the opportunity to comment on the Schedule of Main Modificacons Part 2 (Gypsy, Traveller and Travelling Showpeople).

Main ModificaCon MM378:

New Policy: Sites for Gypsies, Travellers and Travelling Showpeople

We have previously engaged with the Council's consultaons on the Gypsy and Traveller Site Assessments, and can confirm that we have no objecons to the proposed sites set out in the New Policy: Sites for Gypsies, Travellers and Travelling Showpeople.

As the Council will be aware through our engagement ac�ies, Anglian Water and Cambridge Water have recently undertaken a second non-statutory consulta�on on the Fens Reservoir — a na�onally significant infrastructure project (NSIP). Anglian Water and Cambridge Water are proposing a new reservoir in the Fens to help meet the growing demands on water supply in the East of England. The reservoir is central to bringing forward new supply op�ons and is iden�ied in the Water Resources East Regional Plan and the respec�ve water companies' Water Resource Management Plans. Our recent consulta�on iden�ied the associated water infrastructure that will be needed to transfer water to the reservoir, and from the reservoir to homes and businesses, in order to secure a resilient and sustainable supply for genera�ons to come. A further review of the sites proposed in this new policy, has been undertaken to take account of the Fens Reservoir associated infrastructure. We water can confirm that there appears to be no interfaces between the proposed pipeline corridor and new service reservoir, and the proposed Gypsy, Traveller and Travelling Showpeople site alloca�ons.

We support the policy requirement to ensure sites have the ability to connect to all necessary u@i@s (clause e), no@ng that foul drainage connec@ons are unlikely to be feasible in many of the site loca@ons, and alterna@ve private wastewater treatment, such as package treatment plants, may be required.

We also agree that proposals need to address all forms of flood risk, including from groundwater, to ensure long term resilience to the impacts of climate change. As highlighted in our consulta\(\text{On}\) response to the main modifica\(\text{Ons}\) (Part 1) a number of communi\(\text{Oe}\) are very suscep\(\text{Oble}\) be to high groundwater levels, par\(\text{Cularly}\) in North West Norfolk, par\(\text{Cularly}\) over the winters of 2020/21 and 2023/24, where these communi\(\text{Oe}\) suffered from extensive loss of service (unable to flush toilets, shower, wash up etc) as groundwater levels rose above the level of the sewer (but o\(\text{Oe}\) not high enough to cause an actual flood), inunda\(\text{On}\) g the public and private sewer networks in these communi\(\text{Oe}\)s.



New Policy: Caravans, Park Homes and Houseboats

Anglian Water notes that clause 2 of this new policy sets out the policy requirements for addi@nal private houseboat moorings. We recommend that this policy should be further strengthened to minimise any adverse impacts, by requiring proposals for new permanent residen@al moorings to have adequate access to wastewater pump out facili@es that connect to the main sewer (and their is available headroom at the receiving water recycling centre). We suggest that the Council considers elements of the comprehensive policy (DM37) on new residen@al moorings in the adopted Local Plan for The Broads which requires "an adequate and appropriate range of ancillary facili@es on site to meet the needs of the occupier of the residen@al moorings".
